#### TO THE CITIZENS AND TAXPAYERS OF TRANSYLVANIA COUNTY:

Realizing that the time has come in Transylvania County when the citizens and taxpayers are more vitally interested than ever before in the question of taxation and the administration of the affairs of the county and town, and further realizing the absolute necessity of immediate action on the part of the citizens and taxpayers of the county if we would save ourselves from individual and collective bankruptcy, we most respectfully urge and request that every citizen and taxpayer of the county and town meet with us at the Court House in Brevard, on Saturday, July 14th, 1928, at 2 o'clock, P. M., at which time and place we will hear discussed the advisability of forming a "Citizens' and Taxpayers' League" for Brevard and Transylvania County, the primary purpose of which shall be to secure to the citizens of the town and county the most economical and efficient administration of their public affairs possible to the end that the staggering burden of taxation under which we are now being crushed may be fessened and at the same time the efficiency of the administration of the affairs of both town and county remain unimpaired.

The "budget estimates" of the amounts necessary to be raised by taxation in both city and county will be made out and filed for public inspection within the next two or three weeks, and the 1928 levy will be made in the near future. We should familiarize ourselves with these matters in order that we may be able to advise intelligently with the county and city officials. As stated above, immediate action is necessary.
