CALLED IN DEATH

Mrs. Sarah L. Norton died early Friday morning at her home here, following an illness of the past two months. Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the Brevard Methodist church, conducted by the pastor, Rev. A. L. Aycock, assisted by Rev. W. S. Price, Jr. and Rev. E. R.
