CHAIN STORE MEN ARRESTED IN S. C.

"Columbia, Feb. 21.—Chain stores in Florence, Union and Spartanburg have been fined for selling short weight packages within the last few weeks, J. W. Shealy, state commissioner of agriculture, commerce and industries, said here today in announcing that prosecutions against other chain stores on same charges are now awaiting trial.

"Mr. Shealy said that in each instance the store was fined \$25 and warned not to violate the weights and measures laws again. More severe penalties, he said, are in store for second offenders.

"Resident inspectors in each of the ten districts in this state are enabling his department to keep in close touch with violations, Mr. Shealy said. The violators in Florence, Union and Spartanburg were apprehended by three inspectors and tried before local magistrates.

"The enforcement of the weights and measures law is under the jurisdiction of my department, Mr. Shealy said here today. "I expect to see that our people get 16 ounces for a pound. The inspectors employed by this department have been instructed to watch all articles of food in package form found offered for sale on the markets in this state and I expect to prosecute wherever the law is violated. I consider this one of the most important laws to be enforced by this office and I expect to see that it is complied with throughout South Carolina."
