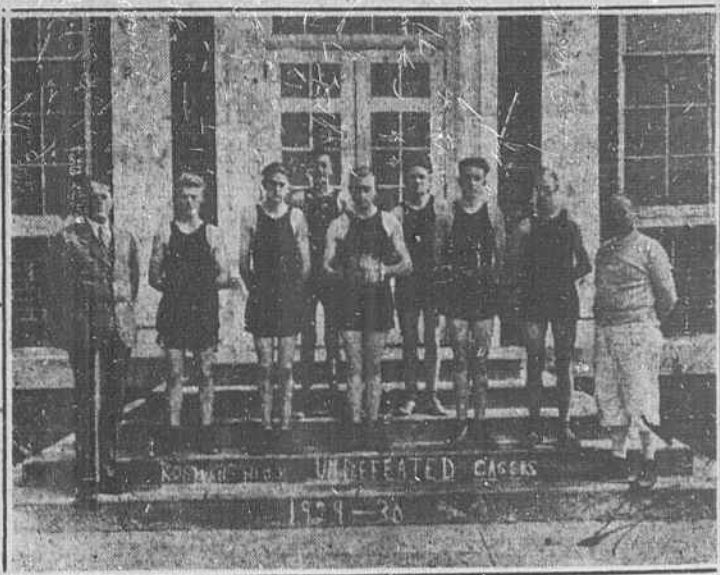

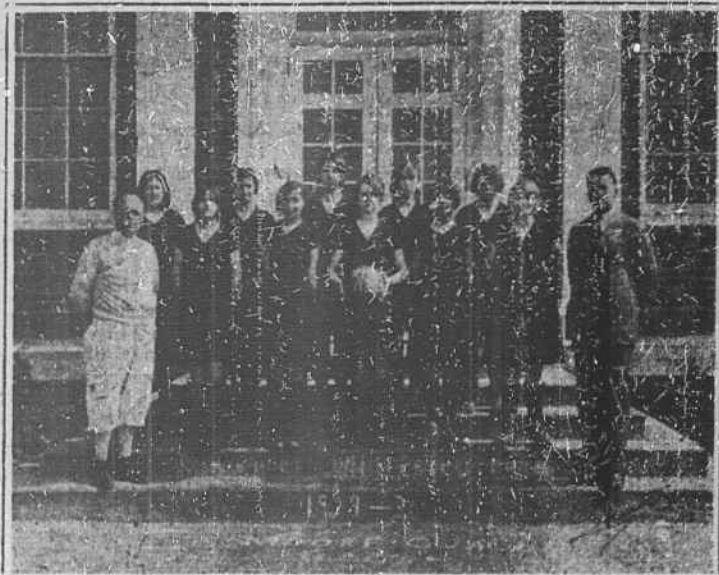
During the season the boys played ten games, scoring 246 points against their opponents 138. The girls played six games during the season, scoring 115 points against 124.
