How to Make the Hair Glossy.



colls, which may be inserted in the Kodak in broad daylight. Film cartridges weigh about one-sixteenth as. much as their equivalent in glass plates and the necessary holders. A roll of 12 Kodak films can be developed more quickly and easily by the average amateur than half that number of dry plates. Films can be developed in the strip before cutting up or be developed singly just as plates must be. when out apart a number of films may be developed in the same tray at one time without danger or injury, and impossibility with plates and an economy in developer. Chemically, films and plates are treated precisely alike, the only differences in manipulation being those apparent from the nature of the two materials; one glass with all its frailties, the other a thin, flexible substance of great strength.
