JOHN RUSKIN, the eminent English art critic and author, was born in London, Feb. 8, 1819, and died at Coniston. England, Jan. 20, 1990. He was educated at Oxford, where he gained the Newdigate prize for a poem. Ruskin was heir to a large fortune and after his graduation from Oxford studied painting. Many of his books are on subjects connected with art, but he devoted much time and thought to sociological studies. He held professorships at Oxford and Cambridge.
