White House Wedding.

(By Associated Press.)
Washington, Feb. 17.—In the beautiful white and gold East room of the White House, a few minutes after noon today, the Venerable Right Rev. Henry Y. Satterlee, bishop of Washington, of the Protestant Episcopal church, pronounced the fateful words which united in marriage Alice Lee Roosevelt, eldest daughter of the president of the United States and Nicholas Longworth, the representative in congress from the first district of Ohio.

The ceremony—the simple, beautiful and impressive ring service of the Episcopal church—was attended with all the splendor of a grand official function and with all the devotional beauty of a cathedral service. It was witnessed by one of the most brilliant and distinguished assemblages ever gathered in the White House, by far the largest company which ever graced the executive mansion on a similar occasion.
