ITEM No. 3. Motor driven hoists for four or six 7 feet by 10 feet head gates.

ITEM No. 4. Five 100 KVA Transformers, 3 sets of 13,200 volt lightning arresters, and miscellaneous high tension switching equipment.

The right is reserved to the Town of Franklin to reject any and all such proposals and the contracts may be awarded on such bids as may be considered to the best interest of the town.

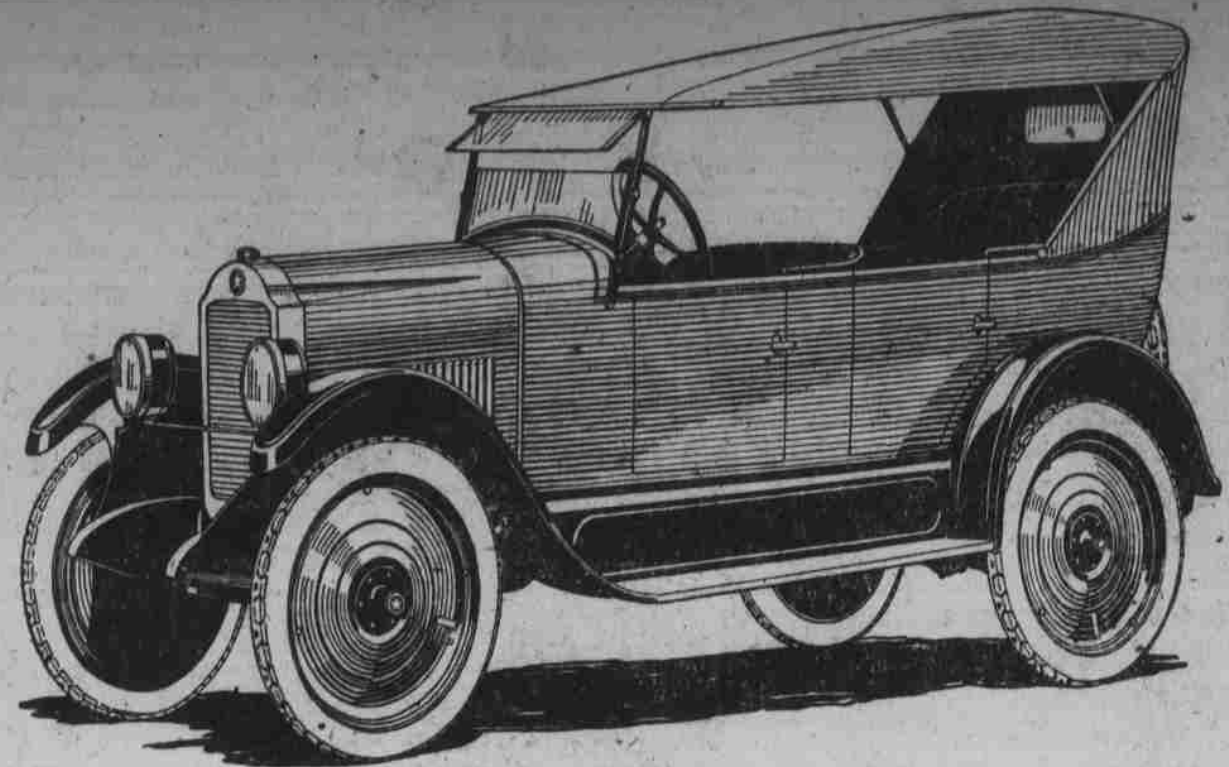
