**General Mica & Clay Co.
Building Addition to Plant**

The General Mica and Clay company, under supervision of Mr. D. D. Rice, general manager, is constructing a large addition to their plant at Iotla bridge. The new building will be located above the road directly opposite the old plant and will be devoted to washing the mica and clay before carrying to the main building for completion of the process.

It is expected that the new building will increase the capacity of the plant about 300 per cent.

The General Mica and Clay company has a contract with the town of Franklin to furnish hydro-electric energy on December 1st of this year at which time electricity will be used for power purposes instead of steam.

May 13th is the date set for the next carlot sale of poultry. The car will stop at Otto on Thursday morning, May 14th for loading poultry. The car will be stopped at Dillard provided the farmers promise enough poultry to justify a stop.

If you have all the eggs you will need for hatching purposes for this season the old roosters should be sold unless they are extra good and worth feeding until next year.

Feed all the milk to the poultry that you possibly can so that it will be fat when the sale day comes.

Another sale will be held just as soon as there is enough for a car load. So do not sell fryers that are too small.

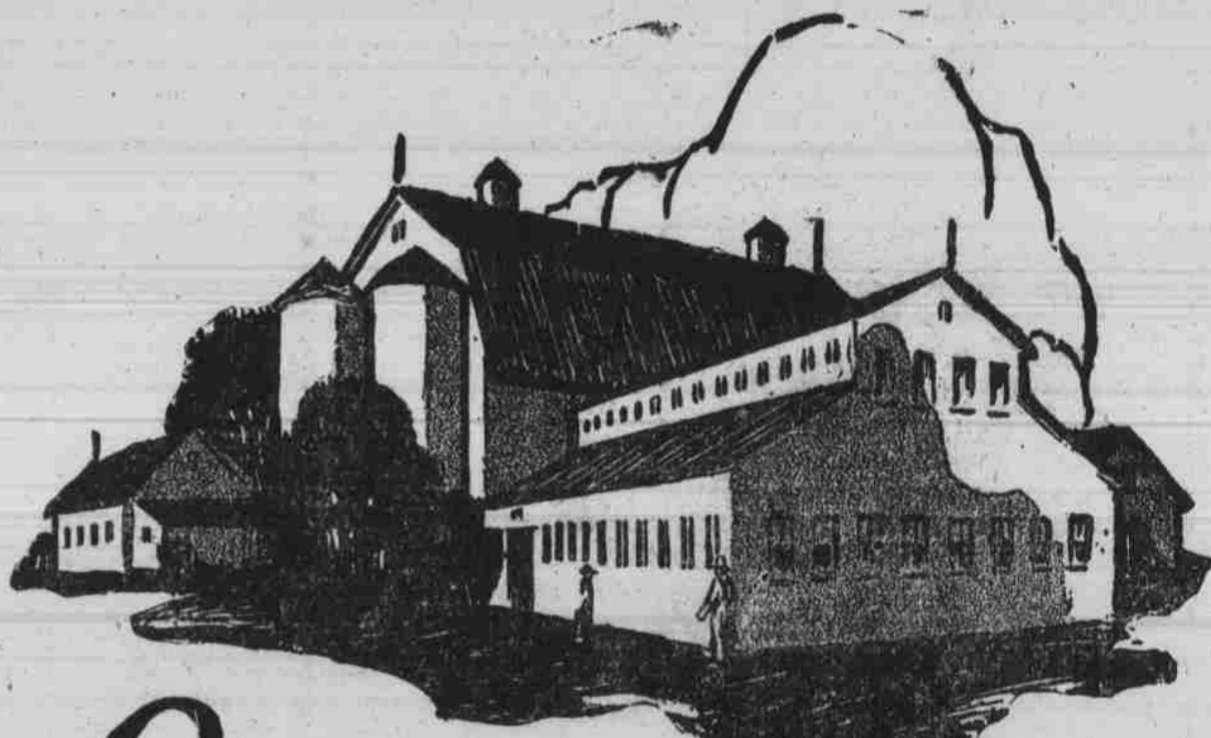
