

It is known as the "Atlanta-Asheville Short Line," as it is approximately 40 miles shorter than any of the other routes to Asheville from this city.

From Asheville to the Georgia State line there is now one complete ribbon of concrete.

Georgia's end of the Tallulah route, of course, is not complete, and there is no definite understanding as to when it will be. The State highway department has been working in both Rabun and Habersham counties for several months, following bond issues by both of those counties. It is hoped that within another year the missing links may be built.

There is a good dry weather road from Clarksville to Clayton and on to Dillard and the North Carolina line, where the solid and unbroken concrete begins. It is not a good road, however, in rainy weather.

There is now a fairly good road between Gainesville and Cornelia, and a very excellent road between Cornelia and Clarksville.

If Georgia now arises to the importance of connecting up a system of paved highways, this and other interstate routes will be completed, as North Carolina has completed hers, and motor travel from one city—Atlanta for instance—to another city in a bordering state—Asheville for instance—will be a genuine pleasure.

It is hoped Atlanta will send a large delegation to felicitate North Carolina on her wonderful enterprise in completing her part of this great and important interstate scenic route—Atlanta Constitution.
