CONDITIONS OF THE AWARD

To Compete for Southern's Cup, Corn Must Have Won at Fair.

Atlanta, Ga.-To encourage the growing of more and better corn in the territory it serves, the Southern Railway System has offered a handsome silver cup, to be competed for annually. The cup will be awarded for the best ten ears of any variety of field corn grown and exhibited by a farmer in Alabama, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, or Virginia.

Competition will be open to all growers in the states named, but the corn must first have been exhibited by the grower at one of the designated fairs in his state. The designated fairs at which exhibitors may qualify to compete for the Southern's cup are as follows:

Virginia State Fair, Richmond, Va.; Central Fair, Greensboro, N. C.; South Carolina State Fair, Columbia, S. C.; Tennessee State Fair, Nashville, Tenn.; Tri-State Fair, Memphis, Tenn.; Chattanooga Interstate Fair, Chattanooga, Tenn.; East Tennessee Division Fair, Knoxville, Tenn.; Kentucky State Fair, Louisville, Ky .; Southeastern Fair, Atlanta, Ga.; Georgia State Exposition, Macon, Ga.; Georgia State Tair, Savannah, Ga.; Chattahoochee Valley Exposition, Columbus, Ga.; Alabama State Fair, Birmingham, Ala.; State Fair of Alabama, Montgomery, Ala.; Mississippi-Alabama Fair, Meridian, Miss.; Mississippi State Fair, Jackson, Miss.; South Mississippi Fair, Laurel, Miss.

The officials of each fair designoted will be asked to forward the ten-ear exhibit adjudged to be the best entering competition at that fair in a sealed package to the General Agricultural Agent, Southern Railway System, Atlanta, Georgia, together with a letter certifying the name and postoffice address of the grower and exhibitor of the corn and the county in which it was grown. In cases in which the corn judging rules of the shelled shall be forwarded with the unshelled cars, All expense of packing and forwarding exhibits from each fair will be borne by Southern Railway System.

As soon as the exhibits have been received from all of the fairs designated, the awarding of the cup for that year will be made by three impartial judges. The names of the judges, together with date of the judging, will be announced in ad-

Any competittor whose corn shall be forwarded to Atlanta from his fair can have his corn returned to him after the final judging by notifying General Agricultural Agent. Southern Railway System, Atlanta, Georgia, at least five days before the final judging.


