

C. of C. Activities

The board of directors of the Franklin Chamber of Commerce, at its regular weekly meeting this week, voted to discontinue the office of paid secretary, at least until January 1.

This action followed division of the work of the organization between the six directors at a previous meeting, with the understanding that these

directors would head committees responsible for the particular branch of chamber of commerce work assigned each of them.

The discontinuance of the paid secretary's position was made possible, it was pointed out at the meeting by the assignment of the work to the various committees; and was made necessary by lack of funds.

This most recent action does not look to a discontinuance of the work of the organization, it was emphasized; instead, the board was simply trying to fit its actions to conditions.

Weimar Jones, secretary of the organization, was asked to continue to handle the correspondence, the publicity, and to work with the organization as much as possible, without pay, for the remainder of 1926.

At the same meeting the board called the regular annual meeting of the chamber of commerce for December 13, the time and hour to be announced later. At the annual meeting seven directors are to be elected, and plans made for the coming year's work.

DAMAGE CASES COMPROMISED

A compromise in the four civil cases in which the town of Franklin was being sued for damages alleged to have been sustained by the cutting of the Palmer street extension was reached by attorneys here Wednesday morning, although no order had been signed when court adjourned, it was learned.

Under the terms of the compromise Mrs. D. W. Blaine receives \$100 damages, S. A. Munday receives \$100, and the other two complainants, nothing. The town agreed to pay the costs in each action.

The total asked by the four plaintiffs was more than \$10,000. The smallest was that asked by E. S. Hunnicutt, who wanted damages alleged as a result of a small house being removed.

BUYS MANY CHICKENS

The Macon County Farmers' Federation has purchased a total of \$3,419.89 worth of poultry from Macon county farmers during the period from August 1 to November 17, officials of the organization report. This does not include the purchases at Otto.

The largest single week's poultry business was the week ending November 17, the report shows, when the value of the poultry purchases totalled \$854.78. The second largest week's business during the period was the week ending August 11, when the figure was \$367.31.

The minimum prices paid during this period, according to officials of the Federation, were 22 cents for fryers and 20 cents for hens.
