

Graham County's Paper

Copy of the first issue of the Graham County News, the latest newspapers in North Carolina, and member of the family of weekly the first newspaper ever published in Graham county, has just been received here.

The paper, a four-page, five-column sheet, contains considerable Robbinsville news, and has a large proportion of advertising, inserted by Robbinsville business men.

It is edited by C. B. Lane, Robbinsville citizen. The first issue went to 400 Robbinsville and Graham county families, and carries the suggestion that the paper, to survive, must have support, both in advertising and subscriptions.

The paper will be independent with reference to politics, and non-secretarian with reference to religion, the management announces.

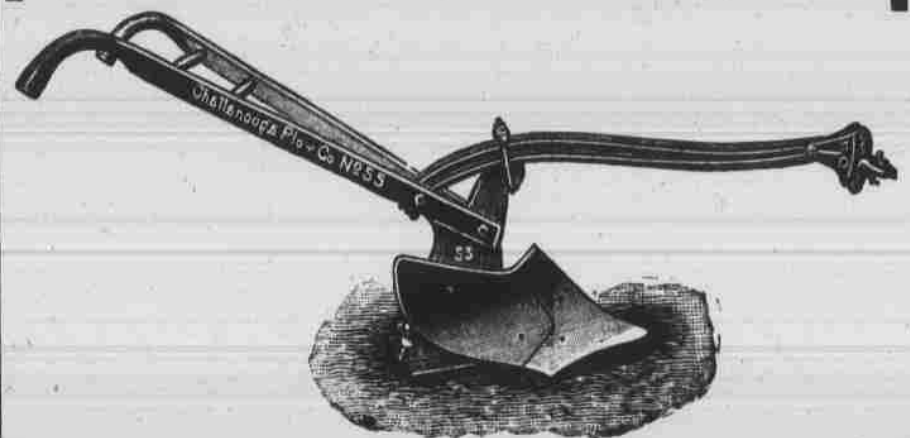
