To all Holders of Elementary B. Teacher's Certificates and Graduates of Standard High Schools.

Before the Teacher Training Class can be organized and guaranteed for next year, 10 pupils, at least, must sign up for the work. This training consists of text book study, observation of teaching being done by experienced teachers, and actual teaching experience, under the supervision of the Director of the Training Class. To all who complete and pass a full year of this work, an Elementary Teacher's Certificate, Class A, good for five years, is awarded. This entitles the holder to a salary of from \$75 to \$95 a month. In great many school systems, no certificate below an Elementary A. is accepted. The whole course for the entire year is free. The only cost is for books and that is a small item.

Any teacher now holding an Elementary B. Certificate and who wants to make improvement in his or her work as well as pay is earnestly requested to give this matter serious consideration. Unless 10 pupils are enrolled, the Department of Education will move this work to some other county.
