dairy cow, it will pay the farmers to feed in addition to the average pasture a small grain ration. Especially is this advisable at this particular time, because it will provide a market for home-grown grains such as corn, and should return more money in the form of dairy products than can be secured for the grain at the present prevailing prices.

When we consider the fact that grass contains a relatively high per cent of protein, it will not be necessary to include but little cottonseed meal in the summer dairy ration. Therefore, it is recommended that a mixture as follows be fed while cows are on the pasture: 100 pounds corn meal


