COUNTY SCHOOLS (PENED MONL

Enrollment of 3,000-Franklin and Highlands Schools to Open in September-List of Teachers.

Fifty-four of the 56 schools in Macon county opened Monday morning, for an enrollment that is expected, when the figures are tabu-later, to run close to the 3,000 mark.

Teachers in these schools assembled here Saturday for a teachers' meeting, to receive supplies, and for instructions. The 56 schools are being taught by 88 teachers, or an average of one teacher to about 32 pupils, on a basis of estimated enrollment. The two other schools-those at Highlands and Franklin-will open

the first Monday in September, it was announced by County Superintendent M. D. Billings, just six, weeks later than the country schools.

When these schools open, a total of between 3,500 and 4,000 school children will be enrolled in this county, it is estimated. Last year's enrollment of white children was 3,625. The list of teachers in the 54 country schools was made public last week by Mr. Billings. The 16 teachers for the Franklin school and the seven for the Highlands school will be announced later, he said.


