ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MACON COUNTY

1. That bonds of Macon county shall be issued for the purpose of the erection and purchase of a jail, in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$70,000.00.
2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.
3. That a statement of the county debt has been filed with the clerk and is open to public inspection.
4. That this order shall take effect thirty days after the first publication thereof after final passage, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under The County Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the county

at an election as provided in the said Act.

The foregoing order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under The County Finance Act showing the assessed valuation of the county to be \$7,522,310.00, and the net debt for other than school purposes, including the proposed bonds, to be \$728,600.00. A tax will be levied

for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest, if the same shall be issued. Any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of such bonds at a meeting of the Board of County Commissioners to be held at 10:00 o'clock a. m., January 30, 1928, or an adjournment thereof.

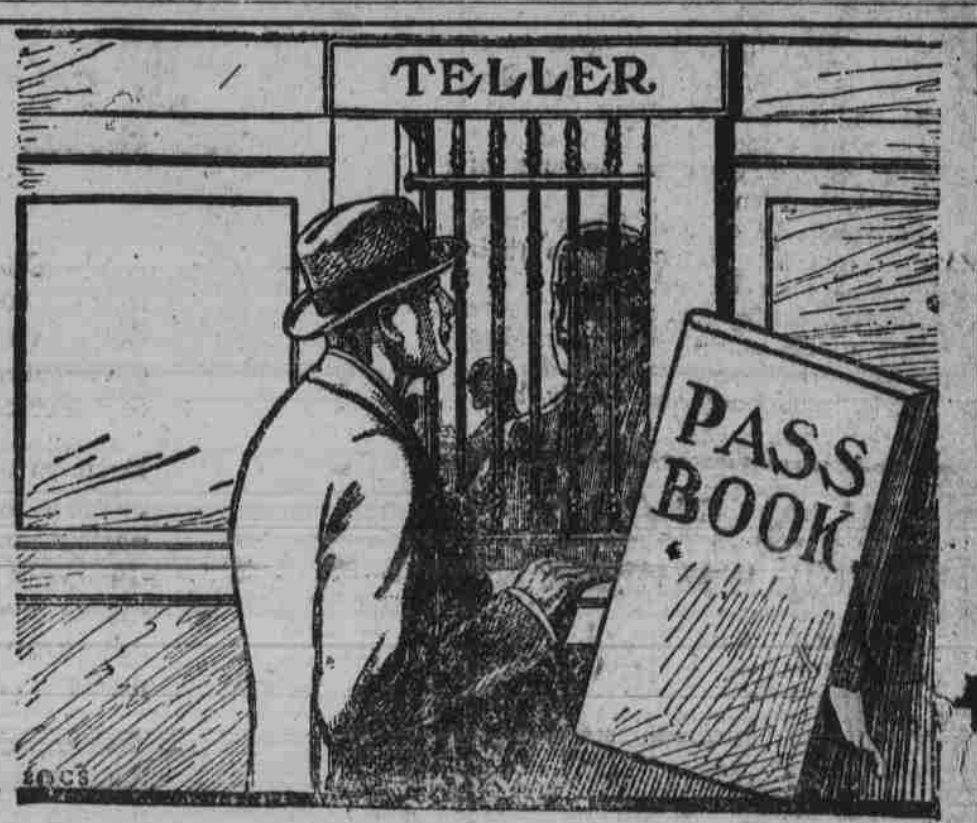
