The Montgomery players have given Highlands a week of enjoyable entertainment.

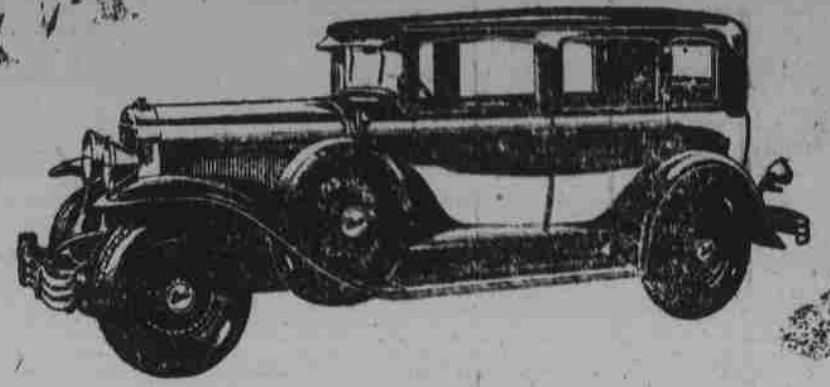

22 when he will carry it to Francis Marion Field at Marion, for their dedication, Saturday and Sunday. The plane is propelled by a twenty horsepower motorcycle motor which in recent tests showed that it is a husky puller. Before putting the wing on the plane Mr. Bennett tried it out going up a steep hill, sitting in the cockpit he opened the throttle and away it went almost taking off up the hill without wing or controls. He says he believes it will take off on level ground within several hundred feet. Although Bennett has never flown a plane he says that he expects to take the new one the maiden flight. Several thousand people who have been watching progress on the ship during the past twelve months will go to the airport opening here Saturday and Sunday to witness the event. Three army planes from Maxwell Field, Montgomery, Ala., and twelve civilian planes from a dozen cities will be on hand for the occasion. A brass band has been engaged to keep the vast crowd entertained between stunt flying and other features.

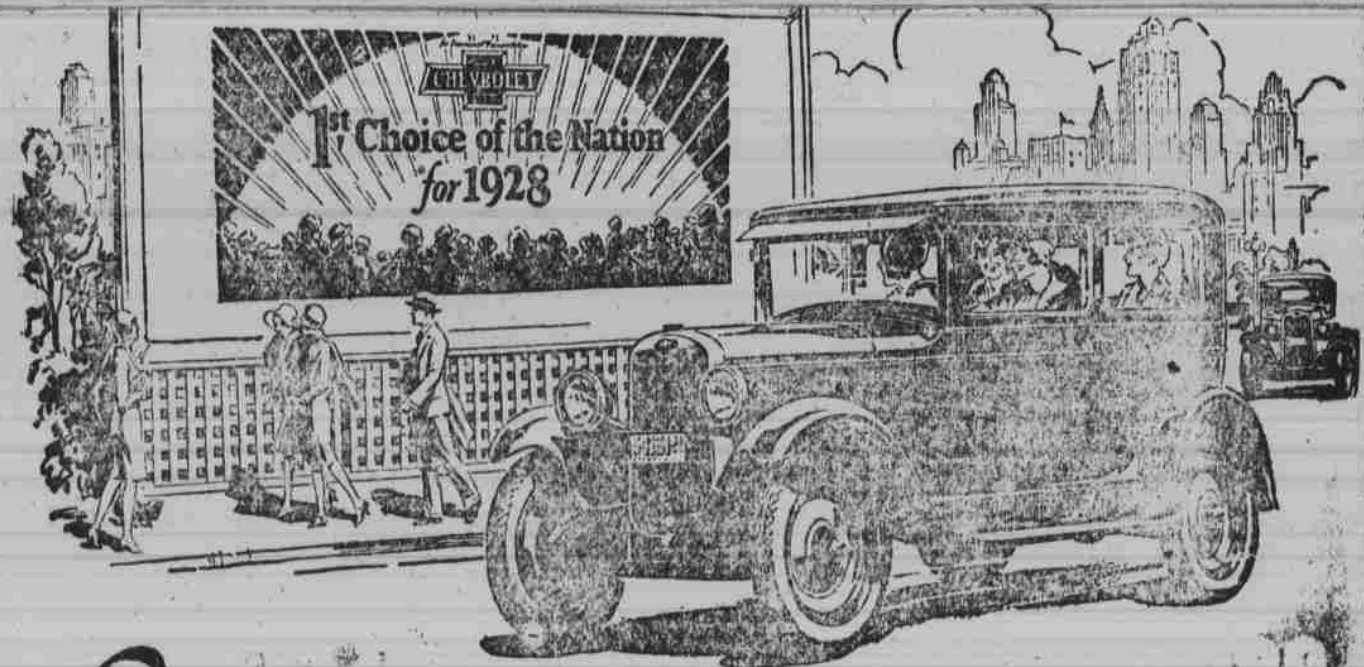
