

New Gas Service For This District

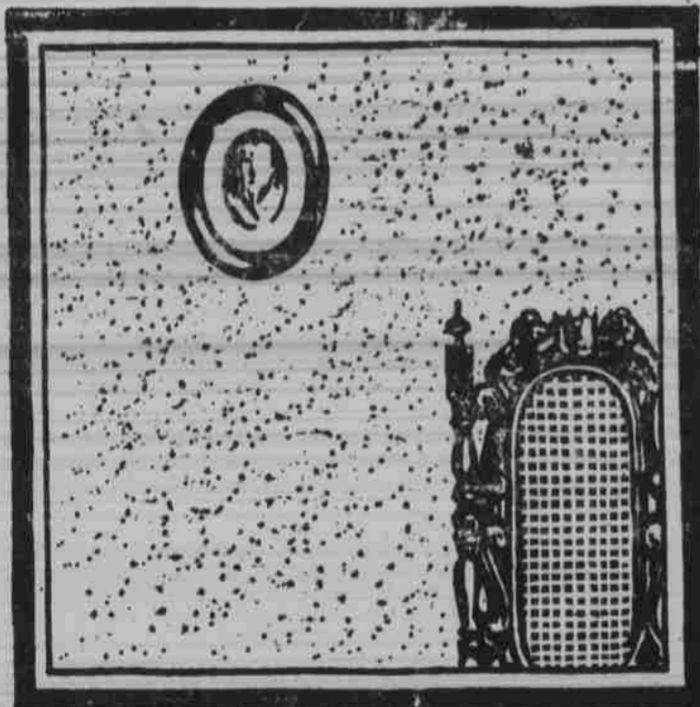
