Friends of Mrs. Oscar Lanning will be glad to know that she has returned home from the hospital and is recovering nicely from a recent illness.

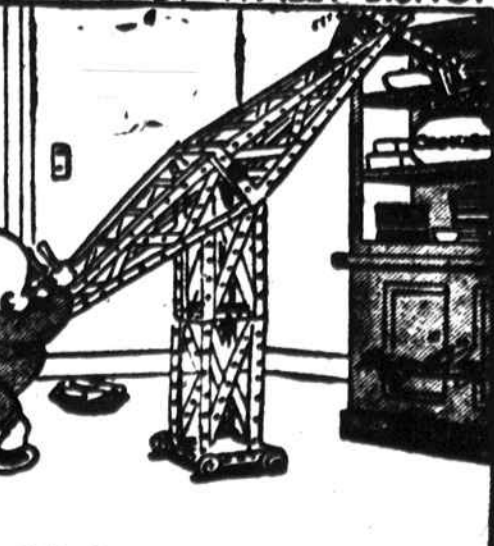
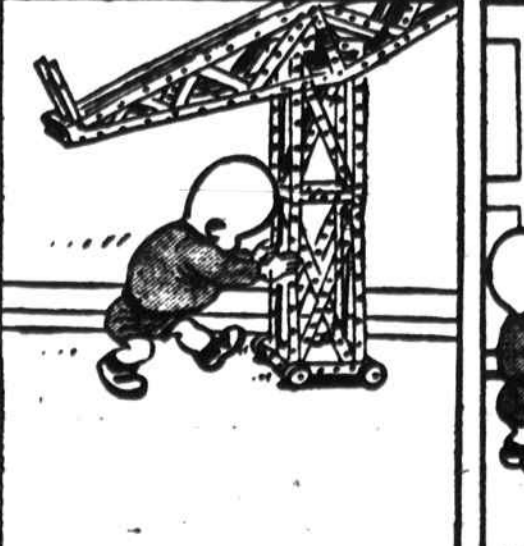
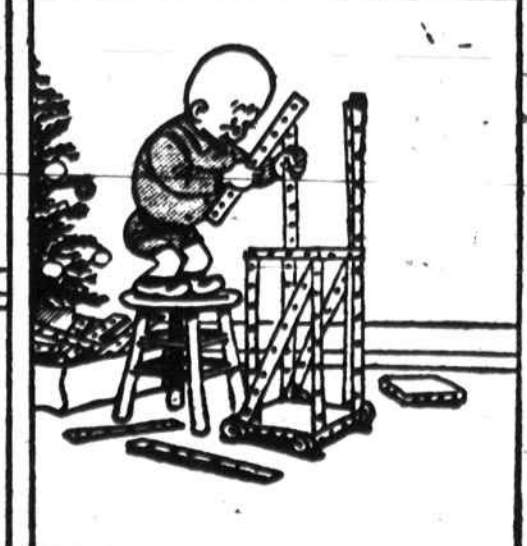
