SUGAR WHOLESALE, RETAIL DEALERS MAY GET ADJUSTMENTS

Sugar wholesalers and retailers may now apply for adjustments of their allowable inventories, William Linehan, OPA Branch Sugar Director, said today in Raleigh.

These adjustments, Linehan disclosed, became effective on March 14, 1947, and are being made because the higher levels of rations effective after April 1, 1947, and the use of 10-pound consumer stamps make it necessary for wholesalers and retailers to have larger inventories so that they may satisfactorily fulfill the demands of their customers.

OPA action provides for an adjustment of 10 per cent in the allowable inventories of wholesalers; 30 per cent for chain retailers operating four or more stores registered together; and 40 per cent for other retailers. Linehan stated applications for adjustments of firms in North Carolina must be filed on OPA Form R-382 with the Sugar Branch Office, Capital Club Building, Raleigh.

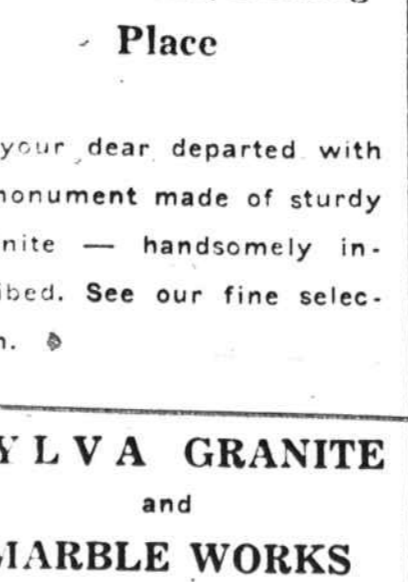
