Will Establish Full **Power Branch Bank**

At Highlands In Macon

At a meeting of the board of directors of the Jackson County bank, held on May 1st, a resolution was passed to double the capital stock of the bank and to amend the bank's Charter of authorized Accounts In Good Shape capital stock from \$50,000 to \$250,-000. This plan will be consumated as soon as the Board's action can be ratified at a formal meeting of the present stockholders and as soon as other necessary legal details can be completed. When the new capital has been sold then the bank will have capital funds, including capital surplus and profits of approximately \$265,000.


