license. The Rule section of the examination consists of twenty-five simple questions that deal with the safe operation of a motor vehicle. The Road test will consist of a drive of some twelve to fifteen city blocks. In the past some applicants have begun road tests with the understanding that the Examiner would tell him to pass red lights, exceed speed limits, and otherwise drive improperly. This, however, has not been the policy in North Carolina nor will it be during this re-issuance.

Previous practices governing the issuance and use of Learners Permits will not be changed. The only change that will occur with respect to fees charged will be the increase in the cost of an operator's license from one to two dollars.

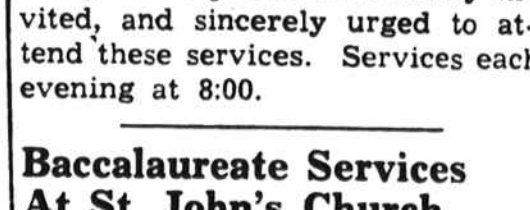
Jarrett Elected President Of Mars Hill Alumni

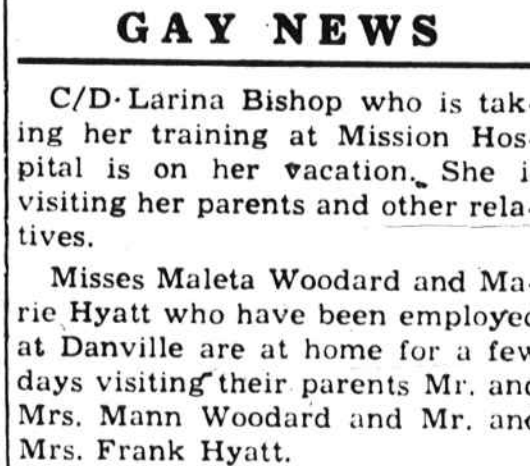
