is now grinding and shipping around 1200 tons of material monthly, according to W. H. Swanson, general manager of the plant. Mr: Swanson stated this week that the plant is only running one shift daily at this time but that the demand is great for the product and it is expected that the plant here will expand its operations to increase the output.

Five men are now employed regularly at the plant with an annual payroll of around \$15,000.00. Payments to farmers and others who supply the mill with the raw material are paid large sums for the spar. Mr. Swanson stated that an average truckload of spar runs around \$45.00.
