# WCTC Catamounts Loose To High Point Panthers 7-6

# FOUGHT IT OUT ON

Two big North State Conference Sylva's hitting parade was led elevens fought on even terms in Asheville's biggest contest of the year Saturday night in Memorial Stadium with the High Point Panthers edging the Western Carolina Catamounts 7-6 before a crowd of 5,000 people.

Held scoreless in the first period by Tom Young's Catamount machine, the Panthers drew first was big Glenn Painter all the way. The Panthers' Curt MacDonald, flashy 140 pound scatback, was held at bay throughout the game and Ralph James had to turn to Painter who figured in every play in the touchdown drive.

With first and ten on the Catamount 23, Painter was trapped behind the line and flipped a lateral to MacDonald who picked up 11 yards to the Cats' 12. MacDonald hi' a fast closing hole in the Cullowhee line for 3 yards and Painter tossed a pass to Carl Tipton on the one yard line.

Painter, the former Sylva high star, was stopped cold twice by the Catamount line before he hit pay dirt on third down. Mac-Donald held and James Petree kicked the extra point which proved to be the winning margin.

But the Catamounts were not to be silenced, Ralph Clark, quarterback took the kickoff on the Cullowhee 17 and returned it to the 39. Jim Bryson, Von Ray Harris, and Paul Monroe then staged the Cats' touchdown drive, each netting a long run and a first down to the cause. Bryson picked up seven yards through center from the eight yard line and from the one yard stripe Von Ray Harris Mrs. J. H. Wilson. 
