The fire suppression organization when completed will include a full-time County Forest Warden in each county, some 13 towermen, 20 smokechasers and approximately 245 district wardens and some 44 fire crew members. Towermen, smokechasers, District Wardens and fire crew members are employed on a part-time or seasonal




