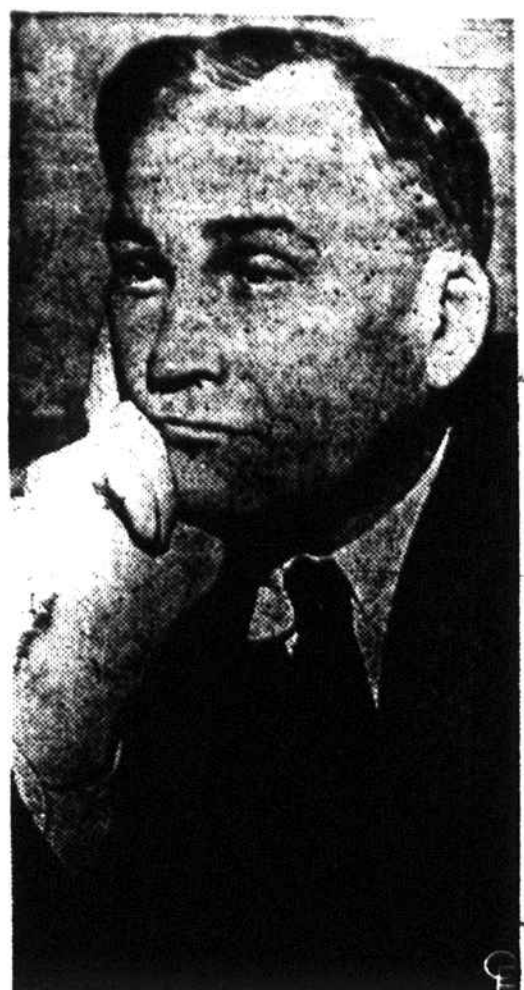

FARMERS ADVISED TO PLACE ORDERS FOR FERTILIZER EARLY

Raleigh, Nov. 10—North Carolina farmers were advised by D. S. Coltrane, assistant State Commissioner of Agriculture, to place orders early for fertilizer in order to be assured of sufficient plant food for their crops next year.

Coltrane emphasized the necessity for an early movement of fertilizer because of a potential shortage of boxcars, lack of storage space and prospective insufficient supplies of fertilizer on a national basis.

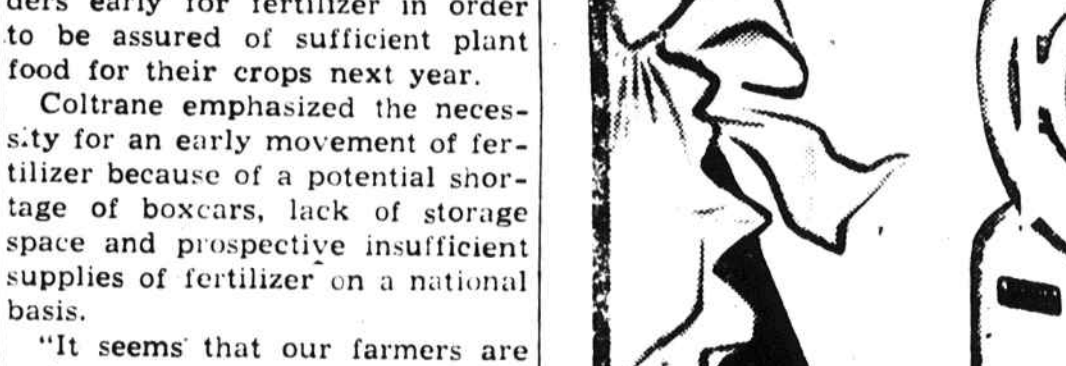

Mrs. Marshall Again Heads Cancer Society's Field Army of Workers

Mount Airy, (Special) — Appointment of Mrs. George E. Marshall, of Mount Airy, for her eighth consecutive term as State Commander of the American Cancer Society's Field Army was announced today. The appointment was made by Mrs. Harold V. Milligan, national commander, of New York.

"The American Cancer Society has been fortunate in having the services of a person of Mrs. Marshall's caliber," Mrs. Milligan said. "She has served as leader of North Carolina's army of volunteer cancer fighters since early in 1941. Under her supervision the organization has grown from a handful of workers who raised approximately \$4,000 to a strong statewide group which last spring raised more than \$177,000 to fight cancer through education, service to cancer patients and research."

Mrs. Marshall has been long identified with the work of the North Carolina Federation of Women's Clubs which she served as district president, second vice-president, education chairman and president. During her presidency in 1936 and 1937, she also served as North Carolina's director on the board of the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

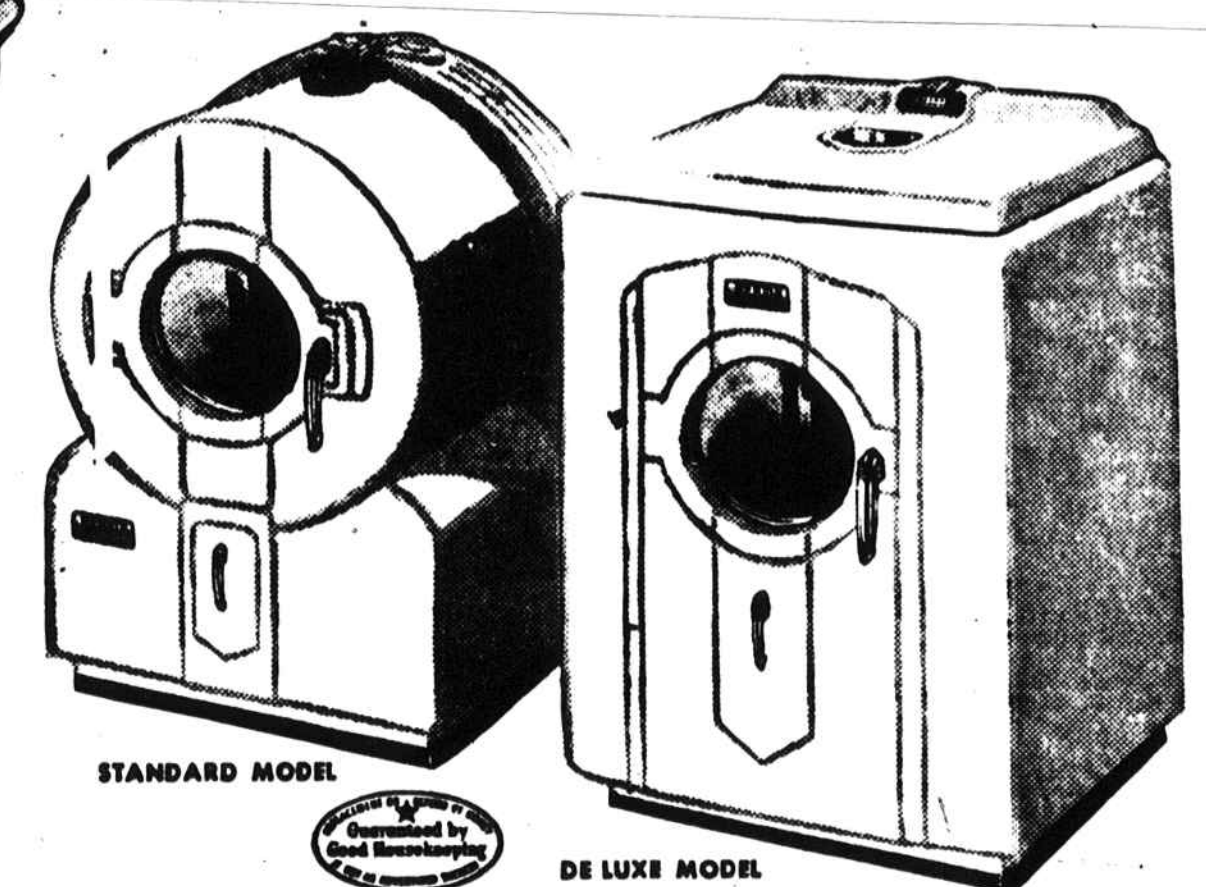
