# ISSUES WARNING AGAINST ILLEGAL CORN DEALINGS

Raleigh, February 16-A warning against the use of illegal measures in the purchase and sale of corn has been issued by C. D. Baucom, superintendent of the Weights and Measures Division of the State Department of Agricul-

Under North Carolina law, Baucom said, corn may be legally bought and sold only on the basis of the bushel measure when shelled. He also said the law stipulates that a bushel of shelled corn shall weigh 56 pounds.

Some corn buyers have been reported as making offers for unshucked corn on the basis that 81

"It is unlawful," he continued, to buy corn by the stand, basket, barrel, tub or hamper. Any person who buys corn by a measure which shells out more than the quantity represented by said measure is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishble by fine or imprisonment or


