STATE COLLEGE ANSWERS TIMELY FARM QUESTIONS

QUESTION — Recently I built a shed out of country sawed oak boards. They had been sawed two years. Now I am told that paint will not stick to this lumber. Is that true?

ANSWER — Oak is such a dense wood that paint will not work as well on it as it does on soft woods. In order to paint oak that is used for an outside surface, the pores in it need to be filled. Unless that is done, paint on an outside oak surface will begin to fail within about two years. Aluminum paint

will not work any better than ordinary paint. About the only satisfactory way to change the appearance of oak used for outside surfaces is to stain it. But stain, of course, will not provide any protection. It merely changes the looks.

QUESTION — Can the Extension farm forester tell me what definite price I should receive for my timber?

ANSWER — No, he can only indicate the approximate value of your timber. Prices depend upon the size and quality of timber, logging conditions, distance from market, and possible market outlets in a given area.

QUESTION—How does the feeding value of oats compare with corn?

ANSWER — Oats are worth about 90 per cent as much as corn

for dairy cows, but they are worth only 80 per cent as much as corn for feeding pigs. The difference is due to the oat hulls. Pigs are not quite so able to digest the hulls as are cattle.

QUESTION — Is there an orchard spray which will not be harmful to bees?

ANSWER — The answer is no. There is no spray which would kill off injurious insects and not harm the bees. To prevent injury to bees, it is recommended that no poisons be used while there are any blossoms on the trees.

Cement floors properly constructed are desirable in brooder houses, broiler houses and laying houses, as they can be cleaned easily and are more sanitary.
