Miss Barrett, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Barrett, Dillsboro, entered Converse on a competitive scholarship which she won in 1944. She is a pupil of Alfred M. White. Before entering Converse she studied with Mrs. Grover Wilkes of Sylva and with Mark Hoffman of Greensboro college.

During the 2 years of her stay in Spartanburg, Miss Barrett has been active in many College activities. She is a member of the Converse College Chorus and has assisted with the production of Spartanburg Music Festival operas. Recently she was elected to membership in Pi Kappa Lambda, national honorary musical society of which the Rho Chapter was established at Converse in 1938.

Miss Barrett has been doing practice teaching for the past two years as a part of her musical education. In 1947 one of her students won the annual Sonatina contest, composed by Franz Schubert and "Symphony" by Robert Schumann.

The program which Miss Barrett presented Friday evening is as follows: "Sonata in A major: Allegro" by Franz Schubert and "Symphonic Etudes" by Robert Schumann. Following the recital she held a reception for faculty members and friends in the College parlors.
