> Corn hybrids, Dr. Moore said. are sold by grades which may require special seed plates. Since nigh yields require good stands, special attention must be given to the selection of the proper plates.

Many farmers rework the cells of either old or new seed plates in order to get an accurate seed drop, Dr. Moore states. When checking the correctness of seed plates, he added, the farmer should adjust the cell sizes so that the largest kernels of corn present will be planted without difficulty. this adjustment is made, the smaller kernels in the grade will ikely cause no trouble, especially n well-graded lots of corn.
