Prior to coming to Cullowhee Mr. Osborne was a senior announcer on the staff of radio station WPTF in Raleigh in addition to serving a field of churches in the Raleigh area. Mrs. Osborne was at that time head of the Spanish departof Raleigh's Needham Broughton High school. While here Mrs. Osborne has taught in the Sylva Central High school and in the modern language department at W.C.T.C.

Mr. Osborne follows his ministerfather's steps in more respects than one, for the senior Mark Osborne, a native of our neighboring Transylvania county, is a musician and humorist. The Cullowhee pastor has been in great demand for programs of entertainment in civic and religious circles throughout Western North Carolina during the past three years, Mrs. Osborne joining him in vocal and instrumental achievements. He has also assisted numerous churches in our mountain area as a singer in evangelistic campaigns and has contributed extensively of his energies to the young people's work of his de-
