Preserving Children

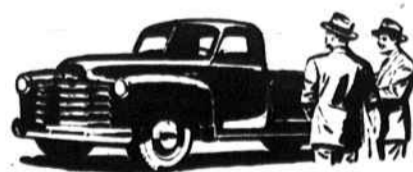
