The bond order is entitled "Bond Order authorizing the issuance of \$450,000 School Bonds of the County of Jackson" and authorizes bonds of the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$450,000 to finance (1) the erection of a new school building in order to effect a consolidation of the Barker's Creek and Wilmot Elementary Schools, and (2) the reconstruction and alteration of the existing Sylva Elementary School Building, and (3) the erection of a new school building to effect the consolidation of Beta, Addie and Willets Elementary Schools, and (4) the reconstruction and alteration of the existing Glenville High School Building, and (5) the reconstruction and alteration of the Cashiers Elementary School Building.

The polls for the election will open at the hour of 6:30 a.m., and will close at the hour of 6:30 p.m., Eastern Standard Time. The election will be held at the same polling places at which the last election was held in Jackson County for the election of members of the General Assembly.

The registration books shall be opened for the registration of voters at 9:00 o'clock, a.m. on June 5th, 1948 and shall be closed at sunset on 19th, June, 1948. On each day (Sundays excepted) during such period, the Registrar for each election precinct in the County will keep the books open between the hours of 9:00 o'clock, a.m. and sunset for the registration of voters in such election precinct. On each Saturday during such period a Registrar will attend at each place in his election precinct between the hours of 9:00 o'clock, a.m. and sunset for the registration of voters.

ON-THE-FARM VETERAN TRAINEES ARE AFFECTED UNDER NEW SUBSISTANCE

The new law increasing subsistence allowances for veterans taking institutional on-farm training under the G. I. Bill will benefit only veterans training on their own farms in most cases, J. D. DeRamus, manager of the Veterans Regional Office, declared today. A trainee must take a minimum of 300 hours of related instruction a year to qualify for the raise, Mr. DeRamus explained. This is required of veterans training on their own farms but the minimum for employee-trainees is 250 hours, he asserted. Thus employee-trainees do not qualify for the increase unless they are taking at least 50 hours a year more instruction than required.

On-farm trainees without dependents will be raised from \$65 to \$67.50 a month if they are eligible for the increase provided by Public Law 512. Those with one dependent will be boosted from \$90 to \$93.75, while those with more than one dependent will be hiked to \$97.50.

Prior to April 1, subsistence allowances were fixed at \$65 a month for veterans without dependents regardless of whether they were attending school or training on the job. For those with

dependents, the rate was \$90. Effective April 1, allowances were boosted as follows for those attending school full time: veterans without dependents, \$75; with one dependent, \$105; with two or more dependents, \$120. Rates remained the same for on-the-job trainees.

The higher rate applies where a trainee is taking as much as 300 hours of related instruction a year, but he is entitled to only one-fourth of his subsistence allowance at these figures since his instruction consumes only a quarter of his time. He is paid at the on-the-job rate for the other three-quarters of his time when he is actually working. This explains why he gets only a quarter as much increase as a veteran attending school full time.

No subsistence is granted a veteran going to school less than a fourth of the regular time. For that reason, ex-servicemen taking less than 300 hours of related instruction receive no part of their subsistence allowance at the increased rate. Their allowance remains the same as if they were on-job trainees.

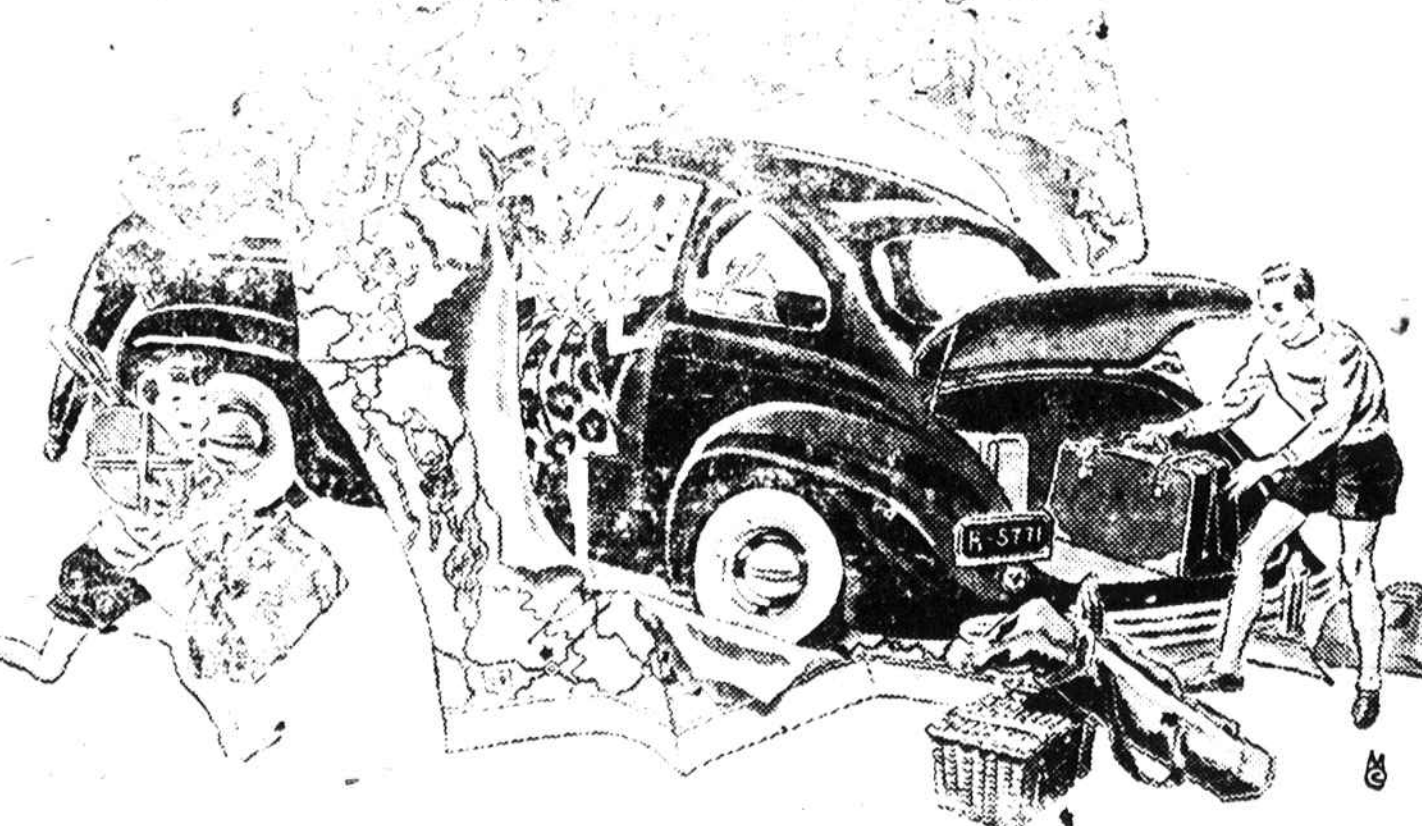
