BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$450,000 SCHOOL BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF JACKSON.

WHEREAS, the County Board of Education of the County of Jackson has certified to the County Board of Commissioners that said County Board of Education has ascertained and determined that it is necessary to provide the school facilities described in Section 1 of this bond order in order that said County, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State of North Carolina, may maintain public schools in said County for the six months term required by the Constitution of North Carolina, and that it will be necessary to expend not less than \$450,000 to finance said school facilities, and has requested the Board of Commissioners to raise said sum by the issuance of bonds of the County of Jackson; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Jackson as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the County of Jackson has ascertained and hereby determines, that it is necessary (1) to erect a new school building in order to effect a consolidation of the Barker's Creek and Wilmot Elementary Schools, and (2) to reconstruct and alter the existing Sylva Elementary School Building, and (3) to erect a new school building to effect the consolidation of Beta, Addie and Willets Elementary Schools, and (4) to reconstruct and alter the existing Glenville High School Building, and (5) to reconstruct and alter the Cashiers Elementary School Building, in order that Jackson County, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State of North Carolina, may maintain public schools in said County for the six months term required by the Constitution of North Carolina, and that it will be necessary to expend for such purpose not less than \$450,000, and that no provision has been made by local tax or otherwise to raise said sum for such purpose.

Section 2. In order to raise the money required to finance said school facilities described in Section 1 of this bond order, bonds of the County of Jackson are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The County Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds authorized by this bond order shall be Four Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principle and interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the County Debt of the County of Jackson has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This bond order shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided in said Act.

The foregoing bond order was finally passed on the 3rd day of May, 1948, and was first published on the 3rd day of June, 1948. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said order must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
