Snipes Sounds Advice On Spraying Tomatoes

The frequent summer showers so helpful to crops makes it important for growers to be on the alert regarding spraying or dusting for the control of tomato late blight. Tomato plants should be sprayed or dusted after each hard rain even though they may have been sprayed or dusted just before the rain. Spray or dust should be applied to the tomato plants about every week even though the rain may not have washed away the previous application.

Any of the following materials may be used with good results if properly used. Yellow Cuproclite, Cocper-A Compound, Tri-basic copper sulphate by various trade names. For the dust treatment use a prepared dust mixture containing one of the above mentioned copper compounds. The mixture should contain not less than 6 percent nor more than 7 percent.

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS OFFERED TO GRADUATES

Twenty awards of \$100 each will be made to graduates of North Carolina high schools who wish to enter the curricula in either agriculture or vocational agriculture at North Carolina State College in September, 1948. These scholarships are intended for farm boys who need financial aid in beginning their college education, and are made possible by grants from the Sears-Roebuck Foundation.

The scholarships will be awarded primarily on the basis of need, with consideration also being given to scholastic record in high school, participation in 4-H Club or FFA projects, and other community activities. Veterans are eligible, especially those who are married and have children.

One-half of the award will be paid to recipients on October 1, and can be used for the payment of any college expenses, including board and room. The second installment will be paid on January 15, provided the student has made a successful record during the fall term.

Applications must be filed by July 1, 1948, and announcement of awards will be made soon after that date. For application blanks write to Dean of Agriculture, North Carolina State College, Raleigh, N. C.

Bobby Jackson And His Field Of Corn

If weather conditions remain favorable Bobby Jackson of Tuckasee will have an outstanding field of corn. The corn was planted about April 25th and 400 pounds of Ammonium Nitrate and 200 pounds of 4-10-6 was broadcast in front of the cultivator. The corn is standing on an average of twelve inches apart in 3 1-2 feet rows. Look out, Mr. Walter Jackson, or your son will grow more corn to the acre than you. 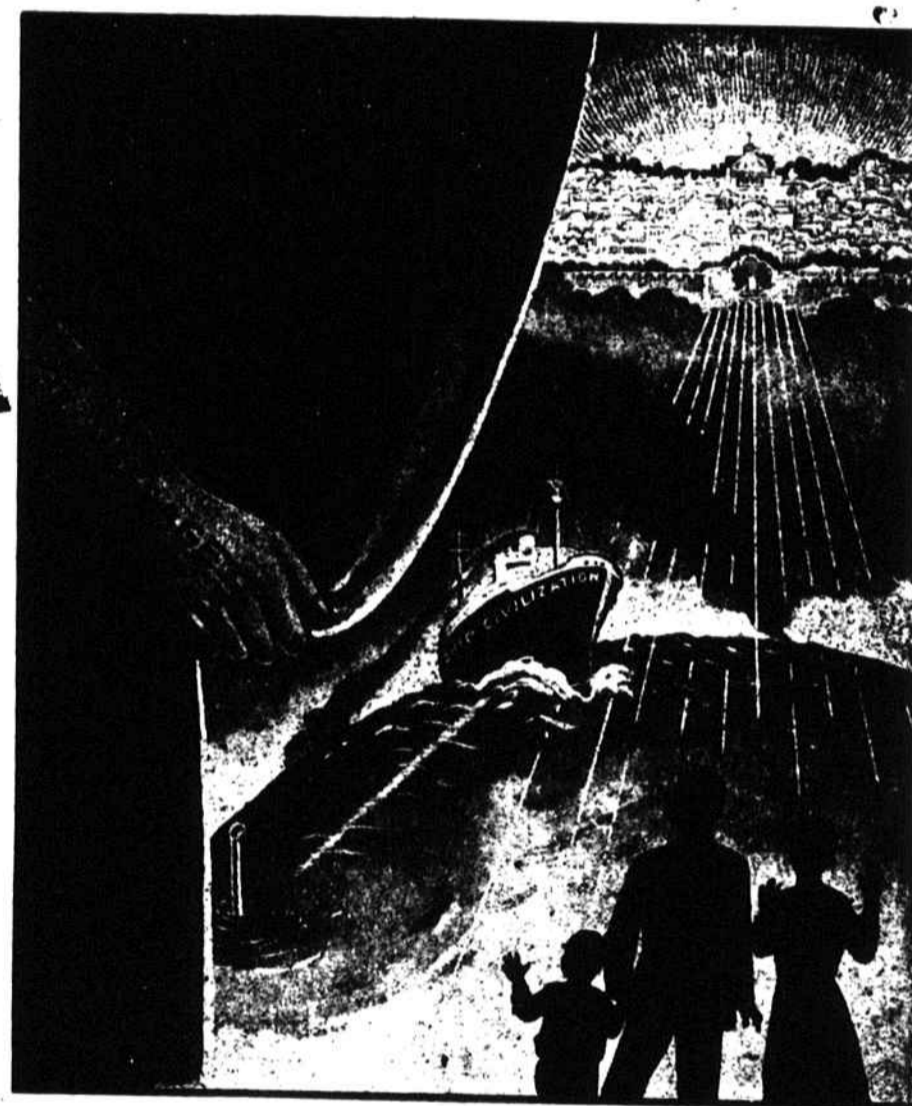

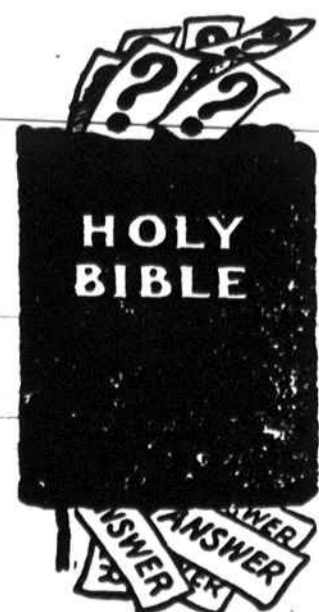
