

### Vets Problems

Q—I have added total disability income coverage to my 20-payment National Service Life Insurance policy. Does the disability coverage continue after my policy is paid up?

A—Yes, provided you have not reached the age of 60. You continue to pay the additional premium for disability protection to the end of the 20-year period when it, too, becomes paid up. All disability income protection ceases when the insured reaches age 60, but payments are continued to those who are totally disabled at the time they reach 60.

Q—I have been discharged from the service for over a year. What is the latest date on which I can enter school or take training under the G-I Bill?

A—You have until July 25, 1951 to start school or training under the provisions of Public Law 346 (G-I Bill), and all schooling or training must be completed by July 25, 1951.

Q—I converted my National Service Life Insurance to 20-payment life. It is possible to convert this policy once again to a cheaper plan of insurance, such as ordinary life?

A—You may, provided you are able to pass a physical examination. However, present regulations provide that such a change must be made within 5 years of the date of the original permanent plan.

Q—I am the beneficiary of a \$10,000 National Service Life Insurance policy. Are the payments I am receiving subject to taxation?

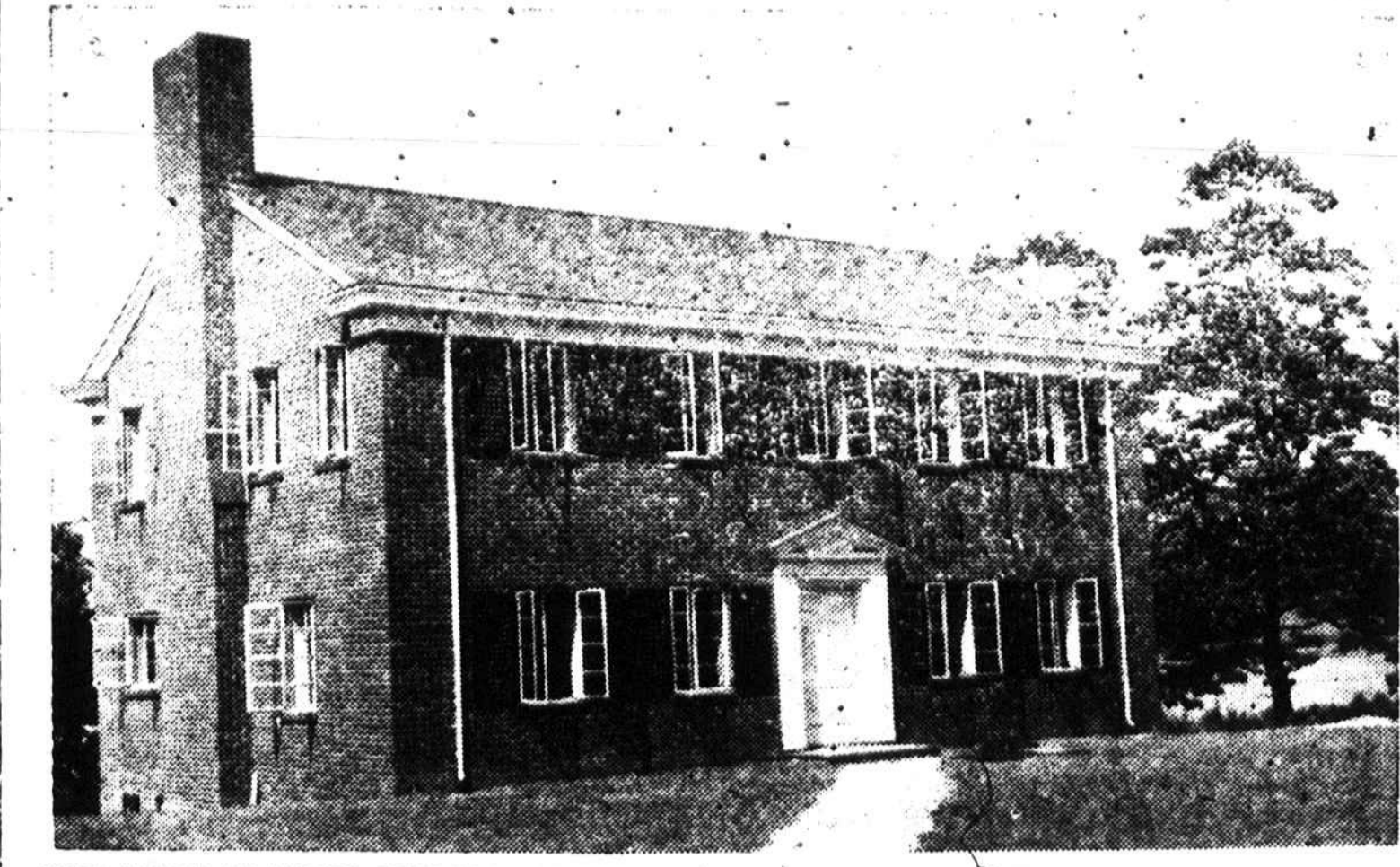
A—No. The payments of National Service Life Insurance as such are wholly exempt from Federal taxation.

### STATE COLLEGE ANSWERS TIMELY FARM QUESTIONS

QUESTION—Can I use an ordinary bucket for a boiling water bath in processing acid foods?

ANSWER — A boiling water bath canner may be made from a wash boiler, a bucket, a lard pail, or any vessel that has a tight fitting cover and can be provided with a false bottom or rack. The false bottom is necessary to hold the jars off the bottom of the vessel so they will not break and to allow boiling water to circulate freely under them. It may be made of narrow strips of wood nailed together lattice fashion or a wire cut or bent to fit the bottom of the canner. The canner should be deep enough for the jars to be covered with 1 to 2 inches of water during processing.

QUESTION — When should I cultivate my grape vines?

ANSWER — Clean cultivation during the summer followed by crimson clover planted in August or September and turned under the following spring is a practice to be recommended. A good seeding rate of crimson clover is 25 pounds per acre broadcast and fertilized

with 200 pounds of 0-12-12 fertilizer. Crimson clover turned under annually will increase the nitrogen and humus content of the soil, resulting in less amounts of fertilizers being needed to maintain good growth and production.

QUESTION — How should the soil be prepared for seeding to pasture or hay crops on plowable land?

ANSWER — After satisfying the lime requirements of the soil, a firm seed bed should be prepared. The seed and fertilizer should be placed uniformly near the surface of the soil. For best results, the field should be cross-seeded.
