**WEED-KILLER GOOD**  
W. A. Crawford on Mill Creek reports good results from the new weed-killer 2-4-D on honey suckle. It appears now that the one application killed the vine completely and there is at present no indication of it sprouting out.

**BELIEVES IN GOOD PASTURES**  
Clifton Moody on Cullowhee Mountain is a great believer in improving pasture land. With the use of lime, phosphate and seed a hillside pasture that was washing away is now being reclaimed. Mr. Moody believes that good pastures is the cheapest feed you can have. He not only pastures his cattle, but also his herd of 9 bred gilts and a boar are to a great extent feeding themselves on white clover and blue grass pasture. He also believes there is money to be made in sheep where they are handled properly. He recently sold 24 lambs from 19 ewes which average 94 pounds each.

**AAA Lime Lime Delivers**  
J. C. Hinson, Chairman of the Jackson County A.C.A., requests that farmers who have not so far done so, contact the AAA office at Asheville to get lime deliveries. The lime is delivered in 50 lb. bags and is available in quantities of 100 bags or more. Phosphate is available in 50 lb. bags, both 18% and 45% P<sub>2</sub>O<sub>5</sub>. Top seeds of different kinds are also on hand. The only pasture seed available this fall are orchard grass and ladino clover. If any of the above conservation material is needed purchase orders should be secured as soon as possible.
