LENOIR-RHYNE BEARS FACE TOUGH SLATE

With all eight North State conference eleven and two other outstanding college clubs on their schedule, the Lenoir-Rhine Bears of Hickory face a rough time as their season opens Saturday night with Erskine at Hickory.

Head Coach Clarence Stasavich has 21 lettermen and eight non-lettermen of last year's team returning to form the bulk of his 1948 squad. Additional help is expected from freshman candidates for the team. Only five lettermen were lost from last year's team which won 5, lost 4 and tied 1.

This year's backfield will be built along the same line as it was in 1947 with Erskine Kutchford of Gastonia and Walter Kuhl of Erie, Pa., running at blocking back. Francis Bonasorte, Pittsburg, Pa., and William Clouse, Bryson City carrying the bulk at wingback. Charles Ostwalt, Statesville, and Haywood Martin, Newton, at fullback, and Gene Miller, Hickory John Charles, Lewistown, Pa., and Charles Harrill, Hamlet, totting the mail from tailback.

Cecil Abee and Raymond Camp, hometown boys of Hickory, are fighting for the starting slot at center. Four veteran guards who will parade from this slot are Carl Wakefield, Hickory, Claude White, Glen Alpine, Frank Snyder, Duncannon, Pa., and Jack Sink, Thomasville.

Both first string tackles from The State's soybean crop will be about 5 per cent less than last year, because of lower yields.
