CATS OPEN HOME SCHEDULE WITH TUS.

New Stadium Ready For Large Crowd

Catamount Jayvees open their 1948 home stand Saturday night at 8 p. m. when they meet Tusculum college of Tennessee. The Catamounts, now even in the win-loss column with one win and one loss, will throw their full strength into the Tennessee boys in an attempt to win their second game of the season. Several of Coach Young's boys bruised up Saturday night in their 14-12 loss to Appalachian in Asheville, but all should be back in shape and ready to go against Tusculum.

The game will be played in Western Carolina's new Memorial stadium which will seat a capacity of 4,000 people. Additional grandstands will be installed which will handle about 2,000 more.
