Dyer Now Stationed At Kyushu, Japan

Seaman Robert A. Dyer, is now based in Kokura, the headquarters City of the 24th Infantry Division, during the Naval Mine Sweeping Operations in the clearing of the Shimonoseki Strait of Magnetic Mines, dropped by the 20th Air Force near the close of World War II.

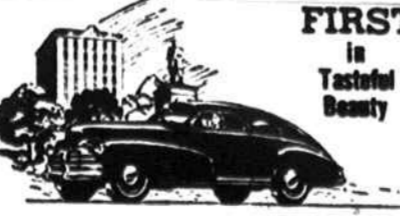
