This is the second request for all farmers who think they may have produced 100 bushels of corn per acre to get in touch with the vocational agricultural teachers, or one of his assistants, the county agent, or FHA Supervisor. It is necessary, of course, that the yield be checked before the corn is gathered.

Good progress has been made by the committee in getting yields checked. It is encouraging to see a great increase in the number of farmers whose yield is approaching or exceeding 100 bushels per acre.

The following farmers of Jackson County have had corn yields checked and are eligible to receive a certificate of membership in the One Hundred Bushel Corn Club: (The list is incomplete but was the best information readily obtainable.)
