The Assassination Of President Lincoln

A copy of the New York Herald published Sat., April 15, 1865—the day President Lincoln was assassinated—is in the possession of J. W. Patterson. It carries a full detailed report of the death of the President, also the dagger stabbing of Secretary of War William H. Seward, Sr., and his son, Frederick, which occurred in less than one hour from the time President Lincoln was slain.

The paper states that the President and Mrs. Lincoln, with other friends, were at Ford's Theatre listening to the performance of The American Cousin, occupying a box in the second tier, when an assassin entered the box behind the President. At the close of the third act the assassin shot Mr. Lincoln in the head, the shot entered the back of the head and came out above temple. The President was removed to a house on Tenth street.

After the assassin shot the President he jumped from the box upon the stage and ran across to the other side, exhibiting a long dagger in his hand, flourishing it in a

...the words "The South is avenged."

The assassin was recognized by John Keegan and the orchestra conductor J. Wiles Booth, the latter a radical secessionist.

In less than one hour after the President was slain Booth had advanced to the home of Secretary of War William H. Seward, Sr., and under pretense of having a prescription was shown to the Secretary's sick chamber. Booth immediately rushed to the bed and inflicted two or more wounds in the neck and two on the face.

A son, Frederick, was in an adjoining room. He rushed to the door of his father's room and was met by the assassin who inflicted two or more wounds in his side.

The desperado managed to escape from the house, and was prepared for escape by having a horse at the door. He immediately mounted his horse and sang out the words "Sic Semper Tyrannis!" and "The South is avenged."

The paper also carries the organ of Governor Vance of North Carolina, advising General Lee to submit to Mr. Lincoln's terms. One dispatch from the then Asheville
