## CARSON - NEWMAN LICKS CATS 14-13 YOUNGMEN OVERWHELM EAGLES IN STATISTICS, BUT POINTS COUNT

Season Ends With Seven Wins And Three Defeats

MORRISTOWN, TENN. —The Western Carolina Catamounts of Cullowhee still rode the one-point jinx Saturday as they dropped their third one-point game of the season, this time to the Carson-Newman Eagles 14-13. With the loss the Cats closed their 1948 campaign with seven wins and three defeats.

Despite the fact that the Cats lost the game they played bruising football from first to last and outclassed the Eagles in every respect but the scoring. By making 13 points the Western Carolinians ran their total score for the season to an even 200 points against 79 for their opponents.

Both Carson-Newman scores came before the Catamounts struck pay dirt. On the last play of the first half, the Eagles got a break and scored. From his own 24 Ernie Cosson quick-kicked 59 yards to the W. C. 17 where the ball rolled dead. For the Cats Cecil Roberts threw an incomplete pass, then fell back to the five to pass again. This time he was hit hard by three, dropped the ball which rolled into the endzone and was covered by tackle Paul Whaley for the touchdown. Fred Woolwine booted a perfect extra point for a 7-0 halftime lead.

Carson-Newman kicked off to start the last half. Paul Monroe returned the kick from the goal line to the 29 and a 15 yard penalty and two rushing plays which netted 5 yards forced Catamount Ralph McConnell to kick out of bounds on the C-N 47. On the

first play from scrimmage Claude Jennings cut through the line, turned down the sideline and went all the way—53 yards for the second Carson-Newman touchdown. Woolwine again kicked the extra point which proved to be game-winning.

A few plays later Hugh Constance intercepted a Carson-Newman pass on the W. C. 43 and returned it 42 yards to the 15. Cecil Roberts went off tackle for 13 yards then passed to Bob Tate in the endzone for the first Catally. Frank Hardin's kick for extra point was only inches to the left.

Back in the ball game, the Cats served up and held almost constant possession of the ball throughout the remainder of the game. Midway of the fourth quarter they struck again. Woolwine kicked from the C-N 13 to the Cat 30 and Pee Wee Hamilton returned it to the 47. Hamilton was hit to Ovie Heavener for 18 yards to the 35. McConnell went through the line for 30 more to the 5. Then Pee Wee hammered down to the one from where McConnell went over. Hardin kicked good and the Cats were behind only 13 to 14.

After the kickoff following the TD, Carson-Newman drove up to the Cats 48 where Cossen-fumbled and Dan Robinson pounced on the ball for the Catamounts. Paul Rogers and Hamilton slashed at an Eagle line until they had the ball resting on the eight. Only a few seconds remained to be played and Frank Hardin went in to attempt a field goal. The game was in the balance and three determined Eagle linesmen broke

Among other injuries this year were Al Capera's dislocated knee, probably the most serious of the lot, ankle injuries to Joe Hunt, Larry Duke and Buffalo Humphries, a knee injury to Harry Jayvees and a few cracked ribs to Ralph McConnell.

Max Beam, Cat right end, was removed from the Carson-Newman game at Morristown, Tenn., Saturday night with a bad kidney bruise. He was taken to the Morristown hospital after the game and was reported Monday morning to be in fair condition.

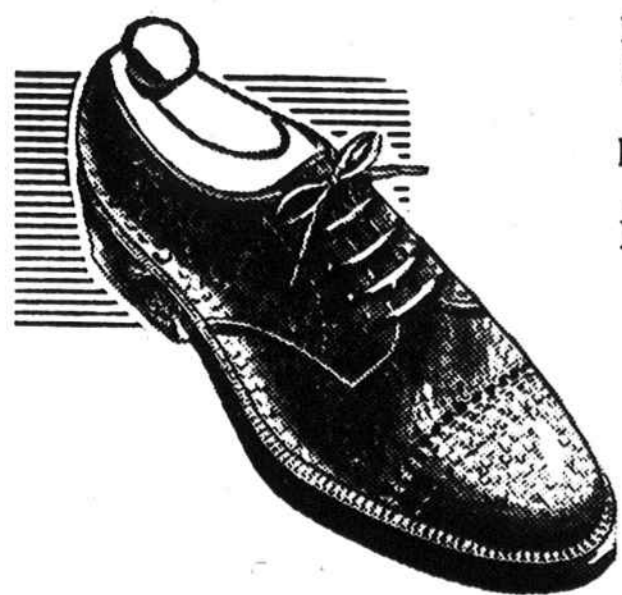

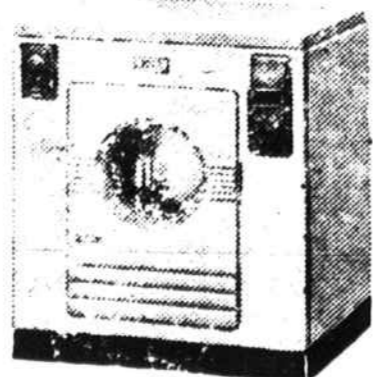
