Pvt. Denver Talmadge Bryson, which was held in the

onal cemetery on Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The widow, Mrs. Pauline Pressley Bryson, of Chapel Hill, also attended the service.

Pvt. Bryson would have been 29 years of age on Monday had he lived. He was inducted in the nfan:ry 351st B. N. 88th Division 5th Army, on September 1, 1943. He trained at Camp Blanding, Fla., Fort Mead, Md., and served in the European and Italian theatres of combat. He received the purple heart and combat infantryman's Sylva school cafeteria at 7:00 badge, and was mortally wounded on July 9, and died on July 16, 1944. He was buried in Italy.

Pvt. Bryson was a graduate of Cullowhee high school, and Western Carolina Teachers College. He was employed at Mead Corporation prior to entering service.

Surviving are the widow, Mrs. Pauline Pressley Bryson, of Chapel Hill and Speedwell, the parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. W. Bryson of Speedwell, and a sister, Mrs. Russell Cline, of Pulaski, Va.
