Brysons Attend Rites For Son At Arlington Cemetery On Monday

Mr. W. W. Bryson, assistant cashier of the Jackson County Bank and Mrs. Bryson left Friday for Pulaski, Va., to join their daughter, and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Russell Cline to go on to Arlington where they were present for the burial rites of their son and brother, Pvt. Denver Talmadge Bryson, which was held in the Arlington cemetery on Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

The widow, Mrs. Pauline Pressley Bryson, of Chapel Hill, also attended the service.

Pvt. Bryson would have been 29 years of age on Monday had he lived. He was inducted in the Infantry 351st B. N. 88th Division 5th Army, on September 1, 1943. He trained at Camp Blanding, Fla., Fort Mead, Md., and served in the European and Italian theatres of combat. He received the purple heart and combat infantryman's badge, and was mortally wounded on July 9, and died on July 16, 1944. He was buried in Italy.

Pvt. Bryson was a graduate of Cullowhee high school, and Western Carolina Teachers College. He was employed at Mead Corporation prior to entering service. Surviving are the widow, Mrs. Pauline Pressley Bryson, of Chapel Hill and Speedwell, the parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. W. Bryson of Speedwell, and a sister, Mrs. Russell Cline, of Pulaski, Va.
