## SPOT CHECK FOR **BANGS DISEASE TO BE MADE IN COUNTY**

Dr. L. M. Becton, Veterinarian, Bureau of Animal Industry, has announced that a spot check will be made for Bangs disease among Jackson County catttle during November, 1950. The tests are being made as a part of the Bangs control program being conducted throughout North Carolina.

Bangs disease is one of the most dreaded diseases transmitted from livestock to humans, causing undulant fever in man. The presence or absence of the disease in cattle can be determined accurately only by blood testing. Infected animals can still be used safely for beef but should not be kept as breeding or milk animals.

Farmers desiring to have their animals tested during the spot check should leave their requests at the County Agent's office or with one of the High School Vocational Agriculture Departments immediately. Approximately ten percent of the animals in the County are to be tested.




