The Board of Aldermen met yesterday for the purpose of granting liquor licenses The twelve bar rooms which have heretofore been running were again granted license. There were no additional appliations.

The most important step that the Al dermen have yet taken in regard to the liquor traffic was taken yesterday. The Board u_animously passed an ordinance requiring all saloous to close at 10 o'clock at night except on Saturday, when they are allowed to keep open until 11 o'clock A violation of this ordinance will work a forfeiture of license.


