John Duval Dodge, son of the late Detroit automobile manufacturer, John F. Dodge, is serving a five-days sentence in the Detroit house of correction for speeding. Dodge also faces charges of driving while intoxicated and transporting liquor as a result of a joy ride in which Miss Emeline Kakerbeck leaped from his car. She is suffering from a fractured skull.

Youthful Millionaire to Face Another Trial.

Young Dodge Released From First Sentence Hour Ahead of Time.

Detroit, March 20 — John Duval Dodge, a youthful millionaire, completed a five days' spender's sentence at the house of correction today, spent the remainder of the day in consultation with his attorneys and departed tonight for Kalamazoo, where tomorrow he is to face charges of driving an automobile while intoxicated and illegally transporting liquor.

A suite of eight rooms was reserved at a Kalamazoo hotel today for the Dodge party. Dodge it was announced, would occupy two rooms and the remainder would be taken by attorneys and witnesses.

Dodge was released from the municipal prison an hour before the expiration of his sentence, but this was not regarded as a letting down of prison rules in his favor. It was to permit him to evade newspapermen and photographers, who, it was believed, might delay Dodge's preparations for appearance in Kalamazoo.

Before his release, Dodge wrote an article for the prison publication praising the officials as "extremely humane" and the inmates, among whom he became popular, as "extremely human." He also commended the "central council" of the prison.
