Call Upon Old Students to Complete \$25,000 Gymnasium Fund For Mars Hill College

Immediate success of the effort to raise \$25,000 for a gymnasium for Mars Hill college is assured, if the alumni and alumnae average the amounts names for each of them, according to R. L. Moore, president of the institution. Letters are being made to all the former students asking them to cooperate in the campaign.

"Besides a gymnasium, the school needs another large dormitory, a laboratory and building equipment more land and an additional endowment to the amount of \$10,000," said Mr. Moore. This larger program will be possible if the older students show their loyalty by sacrificial giving and by commending the undertaking to their friends.

Marvelous giving was manifested at commencement when under the inspiring leadership of Dr. O. E. Sams, president of Karson-Newman college, a collection for the purpose of building a new gymnasium came on without previous planning. It was a fitting close to the first great banquet of the old students. Pledges covering half the cost of a \$25,000 building were made within five minutes. There was not time to secure pledges from all present as the matter came up spontaneously just before the close of the banquet. The following gifts were named:

Reese Continued until next week \$1,000; Rev. J. M. Kester, \$150; W. H. Hipps, \$500; Dr. R. G. Wilson, \$500; A. F. Sprinkle, \$500; Dr. A. T. Hipps, \$500; Arthur Miller, \$150; Rev. W. L. Griggs, \$500; R. S. Gibbs, \$500; Dr. W. F. Robinson, \$500; R. L. Moore, \$500; Rev. J. R. Owen, \$500; J. P. Sams, \$500; L. A. Bryan, \$200; Horace Carter, \$500; A. R. Whitehurst, \$200; Miss Jessie Peek, \$100; C. C. Holmes, \$100; E. C. Jones, \$500; W. C. McConnell, \$5,000.

These pledges are to be held in three equal annual installments, the first third being payable when bona fide pledges to the amount of \$25,000 are secured. The completion of the task is a challenge to the faith and sacrifice of the old students and of the friends of the institution, and is but the beginning of a greater campaign, calling for the raising of a quarter-million-dollar fund for endowment and improvements. "The success of this effort will assuredly mean kings."

On June 12, 1897, Mr Moore came to Mars Hill—just three weeks to the quarter-century mark and he is anxious to complete the gymnasium fund by that time.
